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## Middlefield Golf Course Hole Descriptions

- #1 298-322 yard par 4. The hole has a slight dog leg to the right that is guarded by a large Redwood blocking any shortcut to the green. Both sides of the fairway are lined with trees.
- #2 133-200 yard par 3. The green has a sand trap protecting the left half of the green. This is the second hardest hole playing from the blue tees
- #3 225-272 yard par 4. A sand trap on the left side of the green guards the green.
- #4 264-304 yard par 4. The fourth hole has a large pond on the right hand side of the fairway. There is also a sand trap on the right side of the green.
- #5 123-137 yard par 3. The long green has a sand trap along the right side.
- #6 318-332 yard par 4. The green has a sand trap near the front left of the green.
- #7 74-90 yard par 3. This hole has a water hazard in front and on the right side of the green. The green slopes toward the water hazard adding to the challenge when the pin is on the right hand side of the green.
- #8 305-328 yard par 4. The fairway is lined with trees on each side for 2/3rds of the fairway. Elevated green slopes off front left and right.
- #9 284-308 yard par 4. The fairway is lined on both sides with trees opening to a large green.

Front nine is 2024 to 2293 yard par 33.

- #10 267-304 yard par 4. Hole ten has a dog leg to the right and the fairway is lined with fir trees along the right protecting the approach to the green. The green is long and elevated. Guarded by a sand trap on the right side of the green.
- #11 284-304 yard par 4. The fairway is lined with trees on the right side and out of bounds making it tough for golfers with a tendency to slice. The green is large and long.
- #12 226-312 yard par 4. The fairway is lined with trees on the right side coupled with out of bounds. The left side of the fairway is lined with homes and out of bounds. There is a dogleg to the left and with a sand trap on the right at 250 yards and a sand trap in front of and on the right side of the two tiered green.

- #13 322-364 yard par 4. This hole has a wide fairway that narrows down near the approach of the green. The Row river and wetlands are a hazard along the right side of entire length of the hole.
- #14 85-117 yard par 3. A short par 3 with a sand trap guarding the front of the green which is deeper on the left side.
- #15 430-492 yard par 5. This is the most difficult hole on the course. It is a par five with a sharp dogleg to the left at the 250-yard mark. There is also a water hazard at the 235-240 yard mark. Once safely across the diagonal water hazard, the fairway takes a second turn to the right for a straight shot to the green. There is a sand trap on the left side of the two tiered green and a water hazard coming into play on the right.
- #16 338-402 yard par 4. This hole is the 3<sup>rd</sup> most difficult on the course. The fairway is lined with trees on both sides and out-of-bounds on the left side protecting a short cut to the green. There is a sharp dogleg to the left around the 275-yard marker. Rolling hills on the inside corner of the dogleg adds a challenge to the approach to the elevated green.
- #17 148-216 yard par 3. There is a large pond on the left side of the fairway and trees near the green.
- #18 298-314 yard par 4. The fairway has a pond along the entire left side of the fairway with trees lining the right side. There is a dogleg to the right at the tee off before giving way to a wide landing area.

The back nine is 2398 to 2823 yards long and is a par 35.

Overall, the course ranges from 4420 to 5116 with a par 68. Middlefield is a fun course to play and offers a few challenges along the way.
